## **A Note from the Nurse**

Parents, I have some information I would like to share with you on over-the-counter cold medications. Your child can have **serious** problems resulting in death from taking over-the-counter cold medications **in excess**. I have had some concerns from parents at Carlisle about their children taking an **excessive** amount of cold medication "for fun". I just want you to be aware that this is a serious problem. We worry a lot about our children going out and using illegal drugs. Please be aware that over-the-counter drugs used in **excess** can be just as dangerous. Even something as simple as Tylenol can cause liver failure if taken in **excess**.

Because the drugs are a common cold or cough medication and are sold over the counter, they do not raise the suspicion of parents or other adults. It is important that you talk to your children about the complications that even these medications can cause.
